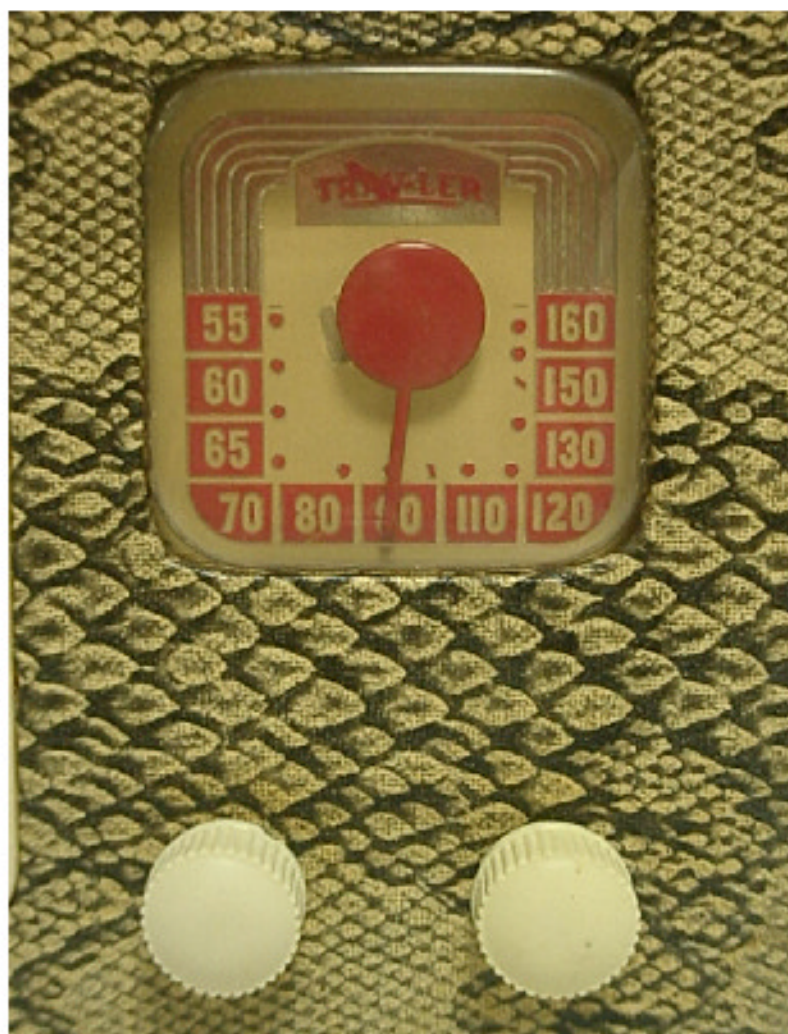

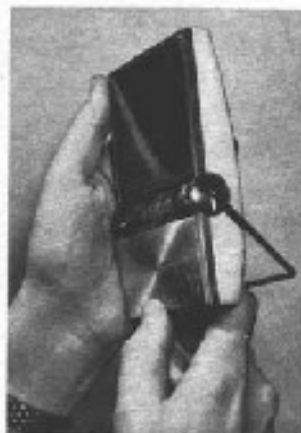
We'll only be having one auction at this meet. The club will be selling tubes, capacitors, t-shirts, hats, and other items. In addition a raffle radio will be available.
