The club treasury now stands at almost \$3780.20.

We had to pay out for the dinner. We had some other expenses as well. We still owe \$200 for the hall. The club purchased a catalin radio. The club will decide what to do with it later on.

At the club table, we did well with tube sales. Raffle Radio tickets were down from last September. We did well with volunteer help. The club table and both

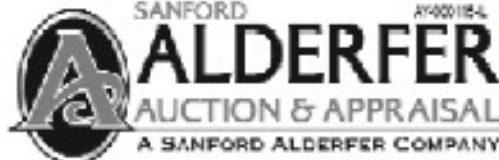
