# **September Meeting Report**

Having just returned from the AWA conference in Rochester, Bill Overbeck led a discussion: "Is E-bay killing the hobby?"

Some observations by Mike Tannenbaum: Vendors on E-bay are selling a broad range of stuff from estates, and there are **lots** of first-time unsophisticated buyers (i.e., it's a retail situation. – ed.) Rochester is and always has been a "wholesale" event. The better material in auction brought good prices. As to the future, "The hobby can absorb all this stuff easily." Most of the quality radios are tied up in existing collections. Speaking of which, word is, the Munkow museum will be auctioned next Summer, around the time of the Elgin meet.

Mike also observed that some common tubes are getting hard to find. Does anyone have fifty 6A8's?

Lewie Neward suggests "All the hot stuff happened on Monday." The good items appreciate, while the ordinary stuff remains stationary. Lewie also tells us there was a tube-auction book-keeping problem at Rochester. Allegedly they paid out \$1000 for \$100 sale, etc.

Mike Koste added a few observation on the recent Kutztown meet: New people are snooping around. General public attendance at Kutztown is a good thing.

The general consensus was that informal discussions of this sort are very worth while, and will do it again in the future.

Lewie Newhard reports he has made the necessary contacts with suppliers, and the club capacitor program will move forward.

## The Program

Dan Lubczanski (hope I have the right name here – ed.) showed us his latest acquisition from France a "Gnomo" miniature two tube AM table set using rimlock tubes. This is a really cute radio. It's only about 4 x 5 x 4 inches and operates from 120 or 240 volts. The label, in French, reads "This radio is warranted for one year except for the tubes which are only three months." This radio is possibly of Italian manufacture.

The evening's main event was a presentation on the restoration of German radios by Dan Schwartzman and Mark Thierbach. They began with the restoration of Blaupunkt Sul-



Like many German sets the Sultan uses a "matchbook" selenium rectifier. Replace it with a silicon bridge plus a 30-40 ohm 10 watt series resistor.

Paper caps are troublesome. The "Ero" brand are all suspect.

On-Off switches are often broken. Bypass the switch and install line cord switch if no replacement is available.

There are many delicate exposed parts. Set the chassis on Rubbermaid dish pan while servicing.

Band switches will need contact spray, expect to repeated every few months. Resistors are generally trouble free.

The dial drives are generally complicated. Broken pot metal parts are "death."

Tuning slugs in coils are often jammed. Don't adjust unless absolutely necessary.

Expect to encounter lots of exposed HIGH VOLT-AGE.

The next set considered was a beautiful Saba Motor drive "300 Meersburg Automatic."

EM85's tuning eyes can be replaced with EM-80's to save money. The American 6U5 is an acceptable replacement for EM-84's

Dan cautions: Don't spend a lot of money on these sets. "You're not going to (be able to) fix them all." Look for dusty ones that have not been worked on. Get rabbit ears with banana plugs for FM antenna.

Mark Thierbach offered so additional tips:

When refinishing cabinets, filler must be used to close the pores in the wood if you want to get a mirror finish. Use shellac for the finish coats because it's easier to work with than original lacquer.

Many of these radios use metalized-mylar electrostatic tweeters dc coupled to plate of output tube. These are often bad because the foam insulating layer inside has deteriorated. Replace it with air-conditioner filter material.

Dan and Mark also provided a useful handout on European tube nomenclature and suggest you check out Wumpus's Old-World Radio at http://www.oldradios.de/ for information and supplies.
