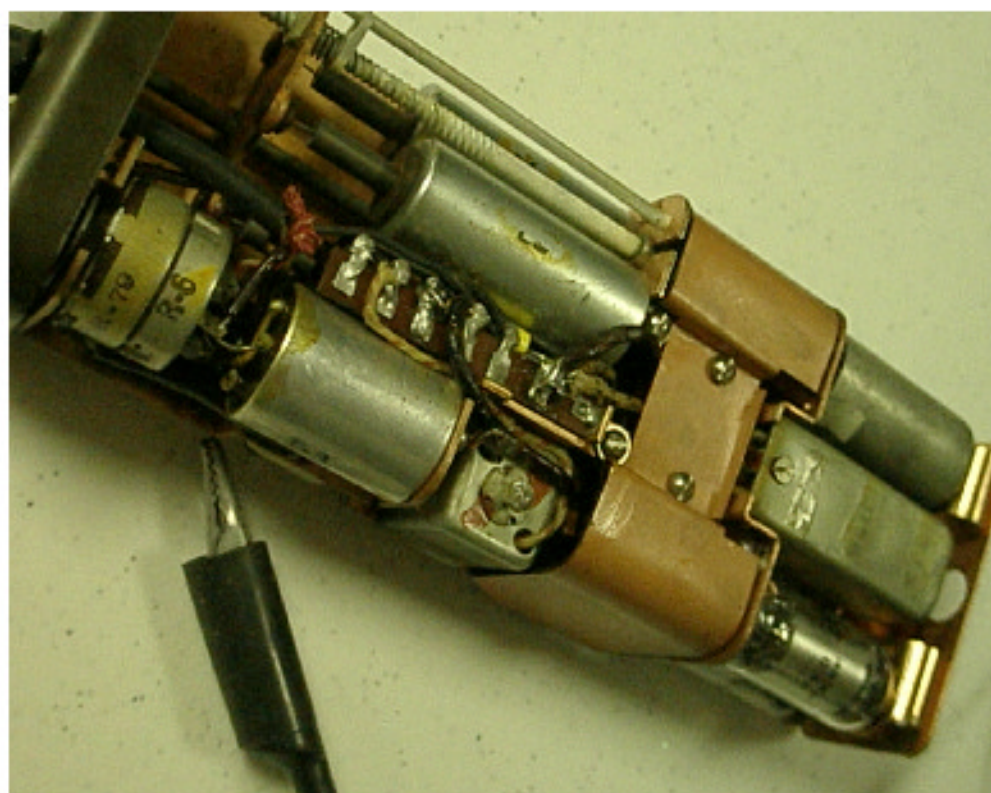

this week, Al suffered a possible fall at the NJARC cottage and is a bit under the weather. We hope to have more details at the meeting.

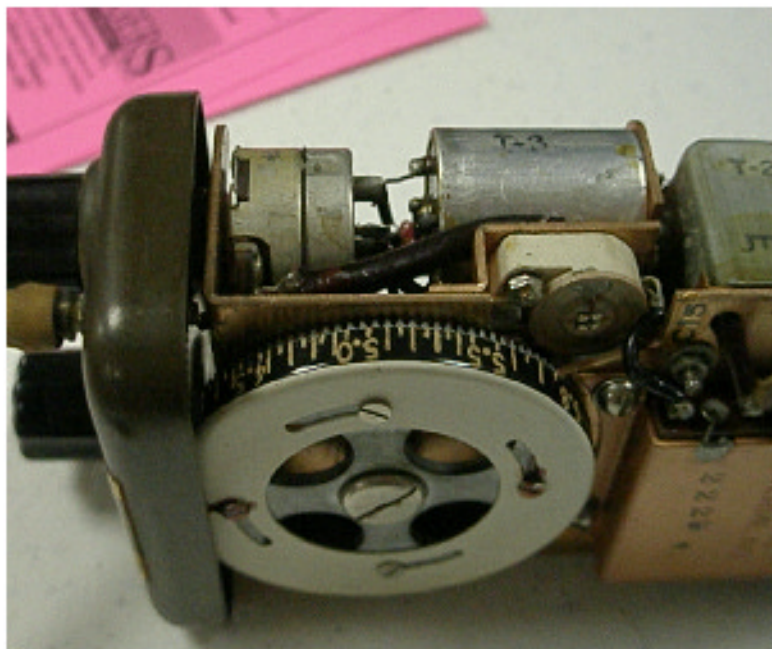
