TV Servicing by Ear

As an old service man, I took interest in a reprinted article in the *Hornspeaker*, a publication from Texas. In it, the author instructed future service men of the era to use their senses and experience before taking time to apply test apparatus.

I used to service TV sets in customer's homes. I would question the customer as to what they had experienced with their TV set. Then I'd ask them to take the children, if any, and leave the room. I would unplug the set, then turn on the power switch. With the back cover off, and getting close to the chassis, I listened while I plugged the set in. If I heard a "rrump", the power transformer primary was O.K. If, in a few seconds, I heard the vertical oscillator start up, and a few seconds later, I heard the high voltage hiss, I knew that the power supply was working. If I heard sound, the tuner and IF's were working. Now I could concentrate on what the problem would likely be from the customer's description, like focus, vertical or horizontal hold, snow in the pix, etc. All this reduces testing time with instruments to a minimum.

The reason for much of this was the fact that all the instrument I had were a V.O.M., some tools, and tubes to test with. This went on until transistors came in, and all the above became academic.
