### Tony Molettiere - 1939-2011

We were all shocked and dismayed to hear of the sudden passing of long time DVHRC member Anthony "Tony" Molettiere on March 7th.

Tony packed a lot into his seventytwo years of life. Best known as one of the three original founding members of our organization, he also was pivotal in establishing the American Historical Jukebox Society.

Besides being a radio collector and historian, Tony served in the US Navy, was a licensed pilot, ham operator, and had a love of cars, books, boating, fishing, travel and vintage hifi.

Having operated North Penn Amusements, a vending, pinball and video game machine company in Souderton for a number of years, and dealing with large volumes of coins in the course of his business, it comes as no surprise that he was also an avid numismatist. Truly a man for all seasons.

Our condolences to his wife Bobbi, daughter Renai and her husband Mark, and grandson Nicholas. And on behalf of the Delaware Valley Historic Radio Club, thanks Tony: We couldn't have done it without you.

## March Meeting Notes and Minutes

At 7:30, President Mike Koste called the meeting to order.

At that time Mike announced, with sadness, the passing of a founding member of DVHRC and fellow collector - Anthony J. ("Tony") Molettiere. Many of our members remember the time when we held our monthly meetings at his business establishment in Soudertown and marveling at the items he had there on display. The club suffered a great loss with Tony's passing, along with that the loss of a good friend. Several attended the viewing and memorial service held on Saturday, March 12. The club made a donation to the Living Faith Fellowship Church in Tony's memory.

Next was the treasurer's report: the club has \$6379 in its coffers. So far, this year we've had to pay out \$500 for General Liability Insurance and \$360 to the Borough of Telford for rental of the meeting place where we hold our monthly meeting.

In other business, Kutztown is two months away and the main pavilion is already sold out! Those who waited will now have to get tables in the overflow pavilion.

Remember, 2011 club dues are due. \$20.00 is all it takes to re-new.

We had some "show and tell" items prior to the scheduled auction. First up, Dave Dean showed off a bit of his handy-work. He made an adapter for the club's Hickok tube tester that allows testing of some early tubes. Hickok made such an adapter commercially - known as the model CA-4. The testing capability of our tube test has been extended thanks to Dave.

Monty Purviance showed a Finnish made set, model Radio Helberg, capable of tuning LW, AM, and Shortwave. Frequencies are marked in wavelengths rather that megacycles. The dial cord stringing was a little unique as it utilizes the cabinet as an integral part of it. This meant you either had to re-string it if you took the chassis out of the case to work on it. Fortunately there was a removable access panel to permit working in the underside if the chassis without removing it.

Lewie Newhard brought in a "show and what is it?" Turns out he has a Conn strobe tuner, a device used for tuning musical instruments. Many remembered it from their high school days.

Last item that garnered quite a bit of attention, even though it wasn't formally a show and tell, was a "portable" radio that Pete Grave's friend Bill Scott brought in. It was a Panasonic model RF-9000. This was

### Addition to DVHRC website

- Members can submit radios for inclusion by emailing a quality digital photo in .jpg, .gif or .png format.
- This is not limited to radios televisions and radio-related items can be submitted.
- The webmaster and/or the DVHRC Board reserves the right to refuse a submitted image.
- Members need to understand that once an image is posted on the Internet, it is public forever.

### Directions to Renningers, Kutztown, PA.

Kutztown is located in eastern Pennsylvania, northwest of Philadelphia and west of Allentown. Nearby major highways include I-78, I-81, I-83 and I-476 (known locally as the Northeast Extension of the PA Turnpike). Please note: Rt. 737, the typical route into Kutztown, is CLOSED FOR BRIDGE REPAIRS. The directions below all avoid Rt. 737.

#### From the North

I-81 South to I-476 to exit 56 - I-78 West to exit 49A South 100. Follow signs for the Reading exit, or Shantz Road. Turn right onto Shantz Road. After 4 miles, bear left at stop sign to merge onto South 222. Turn slight right after 4 miles at Kutztown exit (after first traffic light, where South 222 becomes an expressway). Proceed into Kutztown to Main Street and turn left onto Noble St.. Proceed on Noble Street. about 1 mile. Renningers is on the right.

### From the South

I-81 North to I-78 East to exit 29, Route 61 South. After 4.5 miles, turn left onto Route 662 South. Continue to follow 662 South for approximately 8 miles. Turn left onto North 222 (by Hess station). Bear right at Kutztown exit. Proceed on Kutztown Rd to Noble Street. Turn right and proceed 1 mile to Renningers on right.

I-83 North to 30 East - 222 North into Kutztown. Take the Kutztown exit and continue on road/Main Street to Noble Street. Turn right on Noble Street and proceed 1 mile to Renningers on right.

### From the East

I-78 West to exit 54A South 222. Continue on South 222 for 13 miles. Take Kutztown exit (where free-way begins). Proceed into Kutztown on Kutztown Rd, which will become Main Street and continue to Noble Street. Turn left on Noble St. and proceed 1 mile to Renningers on right.

I-76 West to I-476 to exit 56 - I-78 West to exit 49A South 100. Follow signs for the Reading exit, or Shantz Road. Turn right onto Shantz Road. After 4 miles, bear left at stop sign to merge onto South 222. Turn slight right at Kutztown exit after 4 miles (just after first traffic light, where South 222 becomes an expressway). Proceed into Kutztown to Main Street and continue to Noble street. Turn Left on Noble Street and continue 1 mile to Renningers on right.

I-76 West to 422 West to 222 North into Kutztown. From either South/North, Take the Kutztown exit and continue to Noble Street. Turn right on Noble Street and continue 1 mile to Renningers on right.

### From the West

I-80 East to I-476 to exit 56 - 78 West to exit 49A South 100. Follow signs for the Reading exit, or Shantz Road. Turn right onto Shantz Road. After 4 miles, bear left at stop sign to merge onto South 222. Turn slight right at Kutztown exit after 4 miles (just after first traffic light, where South 222 becomes an expressway). Proceed into Kutztown to Main Street and continue to Noble Street. Turn left on Noble Street and continue 1 mile to Renningers on right.

I-76 East to I-81 North to I-78 East to exit 29, Route 61 South. After 4.5 miles, turn left onto Route 662 South. Continue to follow 662 South for approximately 8 miles. Turn left onto North 222 (by Hess station). Bear right at Kutztown exit. Proceed on Kutztown Rd until you reach Noble Street in town and turn Right onto Noble Street. Proceed 1 mile on Noble Street to Renningers on right.
