Okay, trivialists: Can anybody remember the name of the last record played on KYW before the switch? Well, if you were tuned to 1060 just before noon that day back in '65, you'd have heard DJ Wee Willie Weber play "On a Wonderful Day Like Today." (No wonder they changed formats!)

Finally, if you've ever considered broadening your horizon into the realm of collecting transistor radios, you'll want to be at the October 10 meeting. Using prime specimens from his extensive cache, Bill Overbeck will offer an informative presentation on how to get started, which sets to watch out for, and what makes them valuable. Later this month, WJDM in Elizabeth, NJ, will become the first U. S. station to move to the newly expanded AM band. As reported in the December, 1994, Oscillator, this 500-watt daytimer at 1530 kHz will move to 1660 kHz at 10 kW.

According to a recent article in *Radio World*, since Elizabeth is the largest city in the country without its own nighttime radio service, then-President Bush directed WJDM be put at the top of the list of stations requesting new spectrum space.

General Manager John Quinn would not reveal how WJDM would alert listeners to the change, only that it would probably involve some sort of on-air promotion. To ease confusion, stations moving up the dial will be allowed to broadcast on both their old and new frequencies for up to five years.

To what degree WJDM's signal will improve is still open to debate. Quinn said that in a demonstration at last spring's National Association of Broadcasters show in Las Vegas, a similar signal could be heard "crystal clear" 120 miles away during the day, and as far away as Chicago and New York at night.

MEET REPORT - ROCHESTER

The Antique Wireless Association held its annual event at Rochester (Henrietta) on Sept. 6-9 - this year celebrating Marconi and his 1895 development of a workable wireless system. Notable this year was a massive display of Marconiana (papers, photos, wireless equipment) organized by Jim and Felicia Kreuzer. The inventor's daughter, Gioia Marconi Braga, appeared as guest speaker.

The usual DVHRC and NJARC stalwarts appeared at the talks and in the flea market. One flea-market vendor who set up for three days reported sales volume (dollar-wise) of almost exactly 50% on Wednesday, 33% on Thursday, and 17% on Friday - the latter despite the all-day auction. Saturday had only fitful activity. Weather was good throughout.

Our member Bob Thomas, W3QZO, displayed some fine self-built amateur radio gear from the '50s "classic" period in the equipment contest, winning a blue ribbon in the process. Marsha Simkin of NJARC came up with a far-reaching (and prize-winning) international display of postage stamps dedicated to Marconi and other radio-electronics pioneers. (Bet you didn't know that the Slovak Republic issued a stamp in 1994 honoring Pennsylvania's wireless inventor Fr. Joseph Murgas! His 1939 stamp is a known item, but this was news.)

SURVEY RESULTS - DVHRC MEETINGS

Relative to the survey, I received 20 responses. Most seem to be from newer collectors who are looking for *stuff* (the auction), *help* (the program part of the meetings), and *information* (the social part of the meetings). However, there were relatively few returns from the old-timers who can provide that help. People who offered to put on programs or tutorial sessions were Bill Overbeck and Lud Sibley.

Looking at the survey, the majority want an auction and a program at every meeting, which is what you would expect from newer collectors. Everything on the "program" part of the survey was checked by someone, usually by many. They will accept any type of program from the list! Relative to what is most important at the meetings, the levels of interest were: program, Very high; auction, very high; fellowship, mid- to high; showand-tell, mid- to low; refreshments, very low; business discussions, not checked by most, to very low.

The majority of the respondents do want a Christmas party, with the type of party typically not checked.

There were a few committee volunteers, but very few.

It looks like the present meeting structure is reasonably close to what people want . . . at least the ones who responded.

Along this line, Watch for Bill Overbeck's presentation in October and one by Lud Sibley in November - Ed.



AUCTION HIGHLIGHTS, AWA ROCHESTER, 1995 Ludwell Sibley

As in past years, Ed Gable, K2MP, ran his specialty communications-equipment auction on Thursday. The trend of previous sales (good-quality equipment at prices reflecting that quality) continued this time. A rare National HFC converter was perhaps the scarcest item on sale.

Walt Buffinton sold the goods in the Friday auctions (tubes, literature, and general). Friday's equipment was in good-or-better condition. It featured a rare Crosley Reado home facsimile recorder, a relic of the newspaper-by-radio tests of the late '30s. A Federal "Pleiophone" horn speaker ("not in Floyd Paul's book") set a probable galactic record for a horn, at \$1200. A Signal Corps Model 1917 inductive telegraph set made by the L. S. Brach Co., in VG shape, drew a whopping \$2500. A Japanese one-tube field transmitter from WW II took \$540.
