

Mark Thierback showed off some hybrid portable sets offered by Emerson and Crosley. Both sets employed tubes in the RF/IF sections and transistors in the audio end. The Emerson had 3 tubes and 2 transistors. The tubes were subminiature types.




The Crosley was a book radio. Using miniature tubes and germanium transistors it employed a 45 volt battery for the plate woltage and a 4 wolt mercury hatters for filaments and the transistors



Some discussion ensued about why make a hybrid set when transistors were available (We're talking 1954-55.) Well the answer came in the cost of transistors and the fact many didn't perform well at RF frequencies, though they were perfect for use in the audio stages.

We had a very unusual speaker presented by Ray Shaffy. It was about 24" in diameter and was on a very ornate metal stand.



OTHER ITEMS

I was reminded by Ted Sowirka that we have not properly promoted our capacitor program. Well, here goes... The DVHRC has a capacitor program where members can purchase quality replacement capacitors (mylar and electrolytic) at great prices. See Ted at our monthly meetings. 
